BS Community and Leadership Development- Change program

Rationale: To more efficiently use instructional resources and create a more coherent program with intentional scaffolding of topics across courses, the proposed change to the degree reduces the number of major requirement courses (removed CLD 320, CLD 370 and CLD 430; added CLD 310) and through a series of previously approved course changes, ensures that the major requirement courses are taken in a specific sequence. The proposed changes also leverage the expertise of the available faculty for more emphasis on community engagement. This program change also includes providing more guidance related to the guided electives, requiring students to complete courses from both the Community Change & Development pathway and the Leading & Learning in Communities pathway. Finally, an Advanced Studies option is being added to the degree.

Community and Leadership Development minor- Change minor

Rationale: The CLD Minor requirements will change to correspond with the changes in the BS-CLD curriculum. The total required hours for the CLD minor increases from 15 to 18 credit hours. This proposed curriculum enables CLD minors to add the value of expertise in community engagement to their undergraduate degree. The minor core credit hours will be reduced from 9 to 6 credit hours while minor elective credit hours will be increased from 6 to 12 credit hours. Instead of selecting three out of four CLD courses, all minor students will be required to complete CLD 260 and CLD 310. This means all CLD major and minor students will share a set of knowledge, skills, and experience. By increasing elective credit hours, minor students will be able to select CLD courses based on their academic interests and career aspirations.
